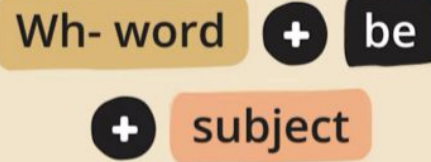

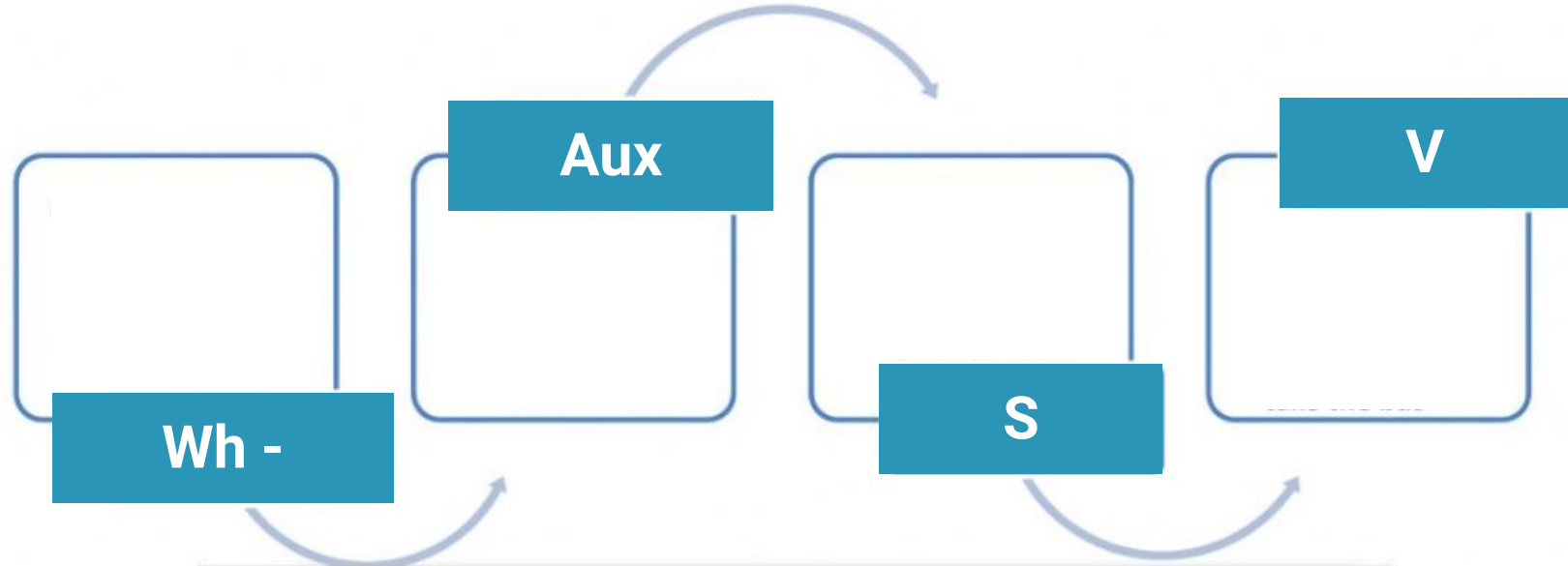
## Wh- Questions

# Exceptions

*Wh-* words usually act as the **object** of a sentence.

## **Wh- + Aux + S + V**

- She (S) likes (V) pizza (O).
- What (O) does (Aux) she (S) like (V)?

However, some *Wh-* words, especially *who* and *what*, can also act as **subjects** in English.

## **Wh- + V (+ O)**

- Nobody (S) cares (V).
- Who (S) cares (V)?
- Something (S) happened (V).
- What (S) happened (V)?

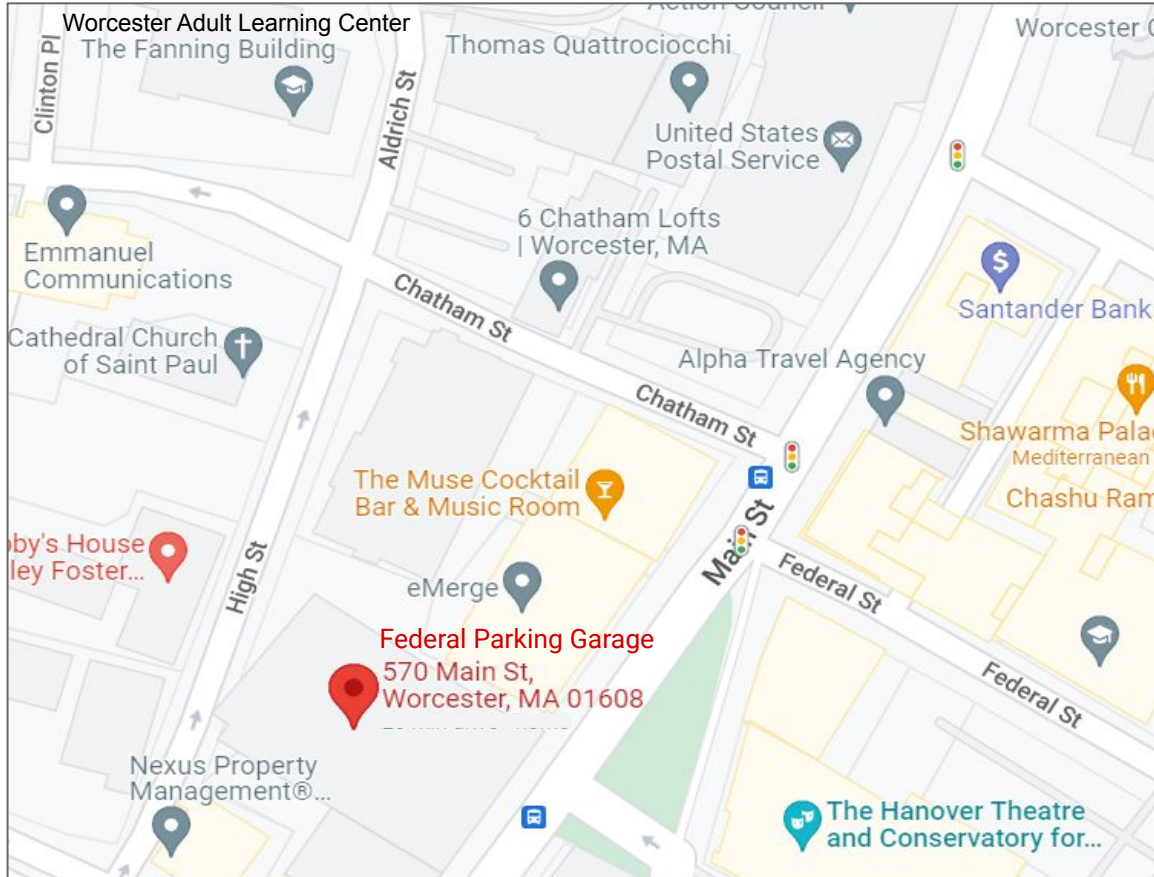

Students can park for free at the Federal Parking Garage, 570 Main Street, Worcester, MA.


The garage front entrance is on Main Street.

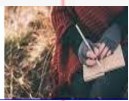

### Release of Information

The Massachusetts Department of Elementary and Secondary Education (DESE) funds your adult education program, the Worcester Adult Learning Center, and almost 100 others like it.
