Email Checklist

After you write your email, check your spelling. Fix any mistakes you see. When you are happy with your email, hit "Send."

- ✓ Did I type the recipient's email address correctly?
- ✓ Did I include a strong subject?
- ✓ Did I add other recipients correctly?
- ✓ Did I include a greeting?
- ✓ Did I include a body?
- ✓ Did I close the email appropriately?
- ✓ Is the email written in an appropriate tone (formal or informal)?
- ✓ Did I attach a document or image that I said would be attached?
- ✓ Did I check my spelling before hitting "Send"?

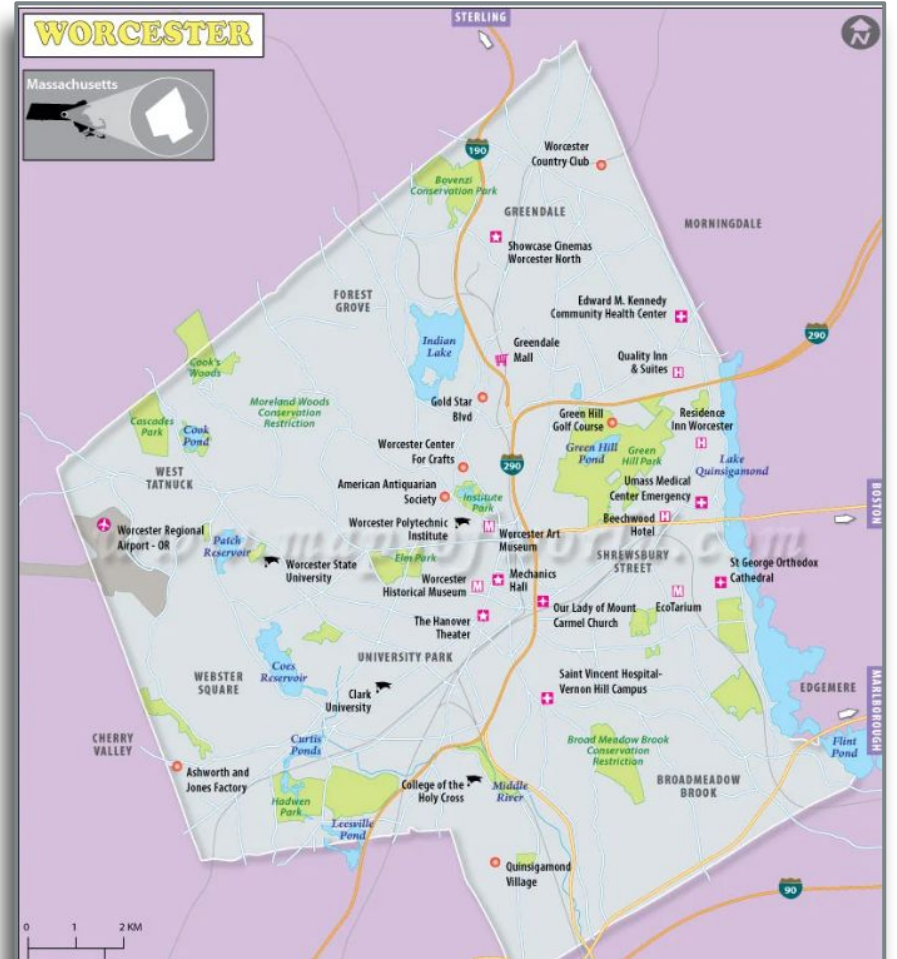

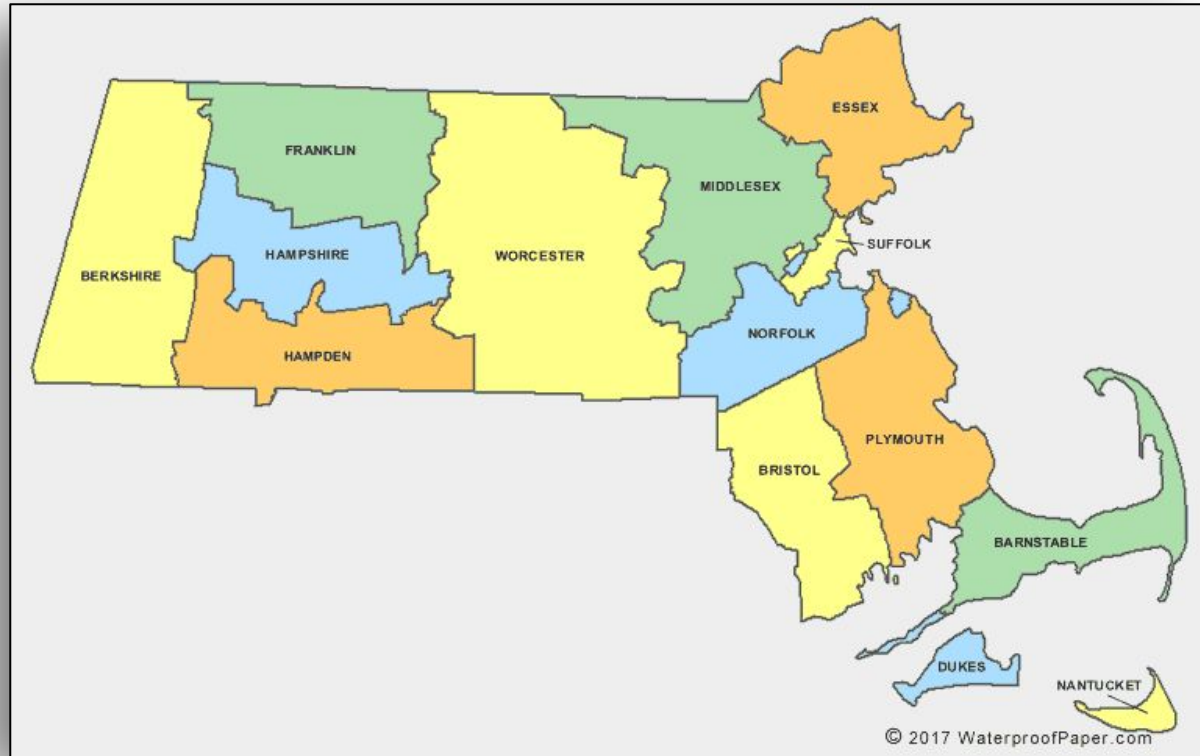

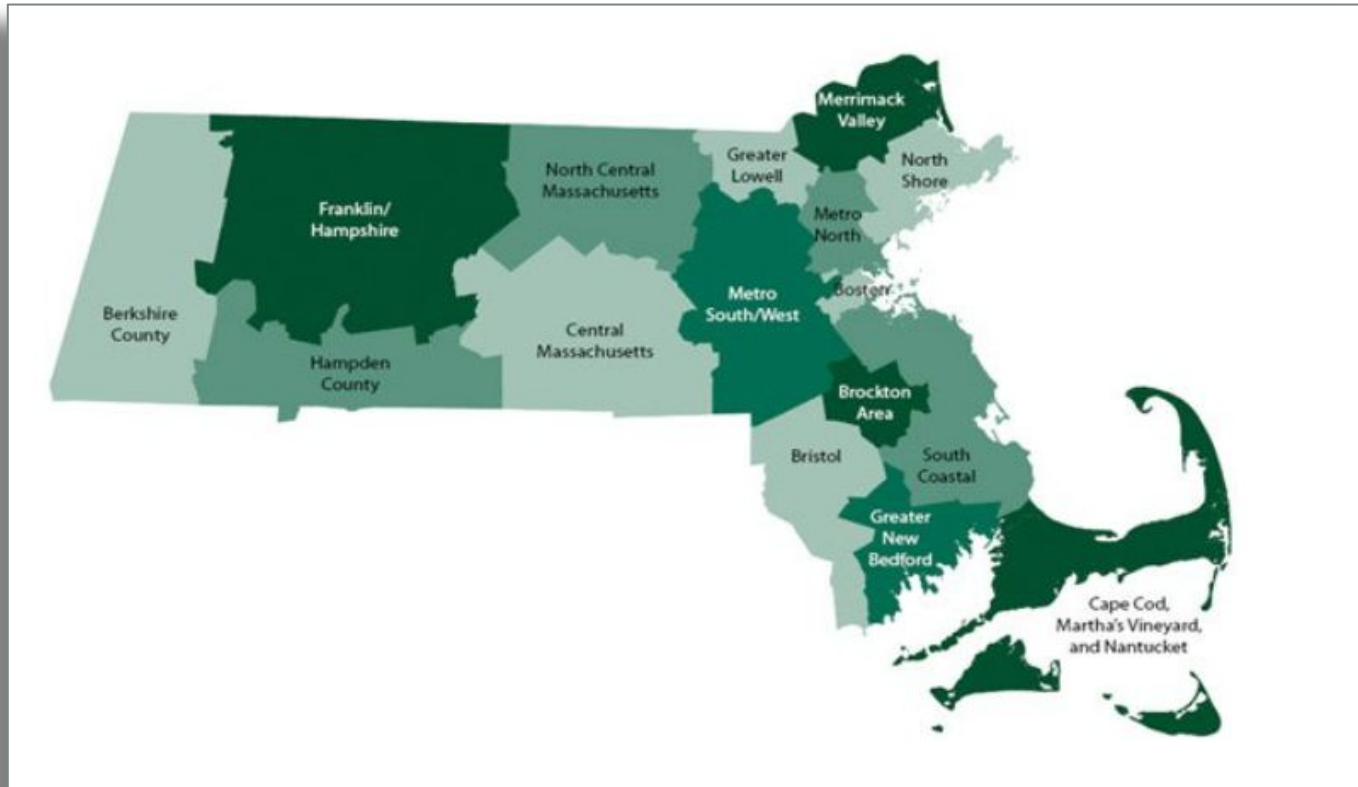

MASSACHUSETTS COUNTIES



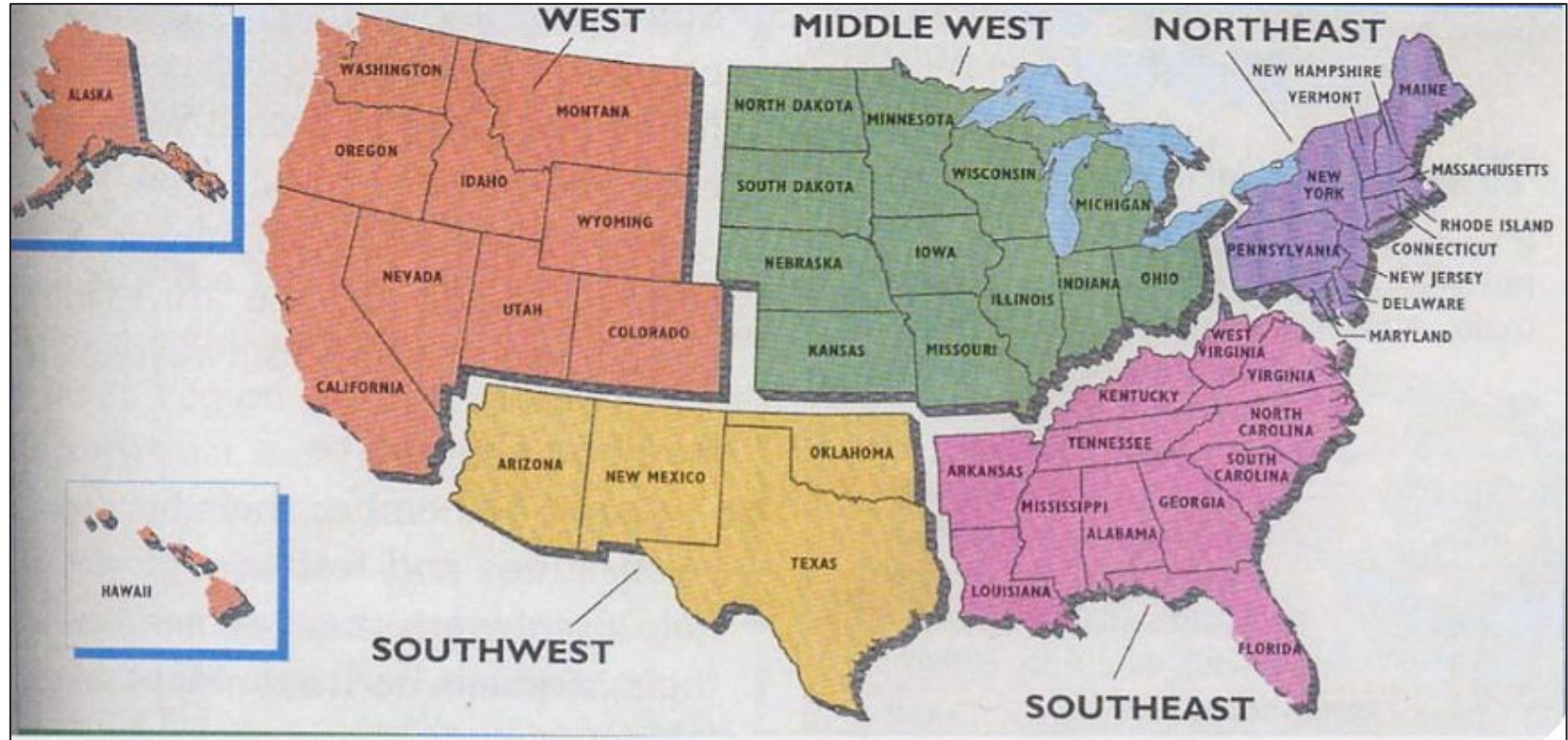

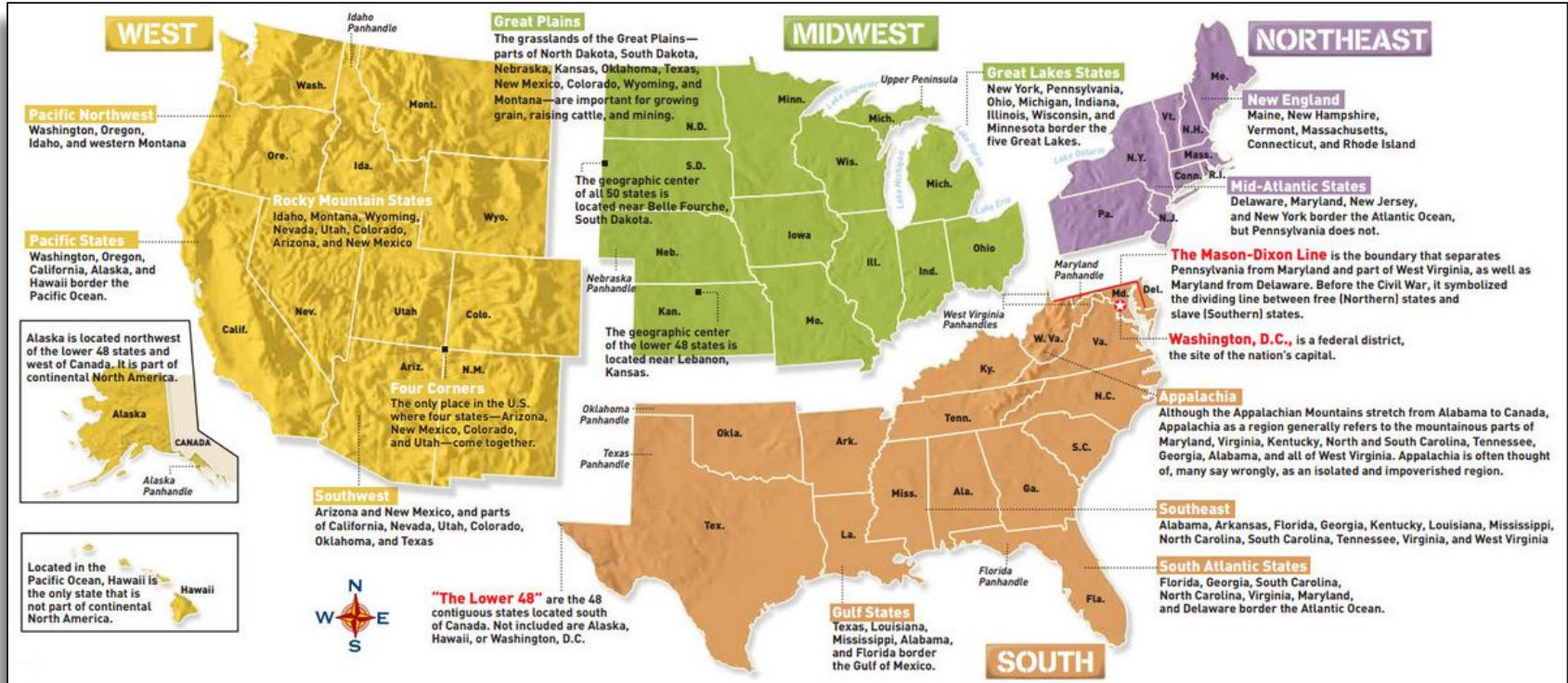

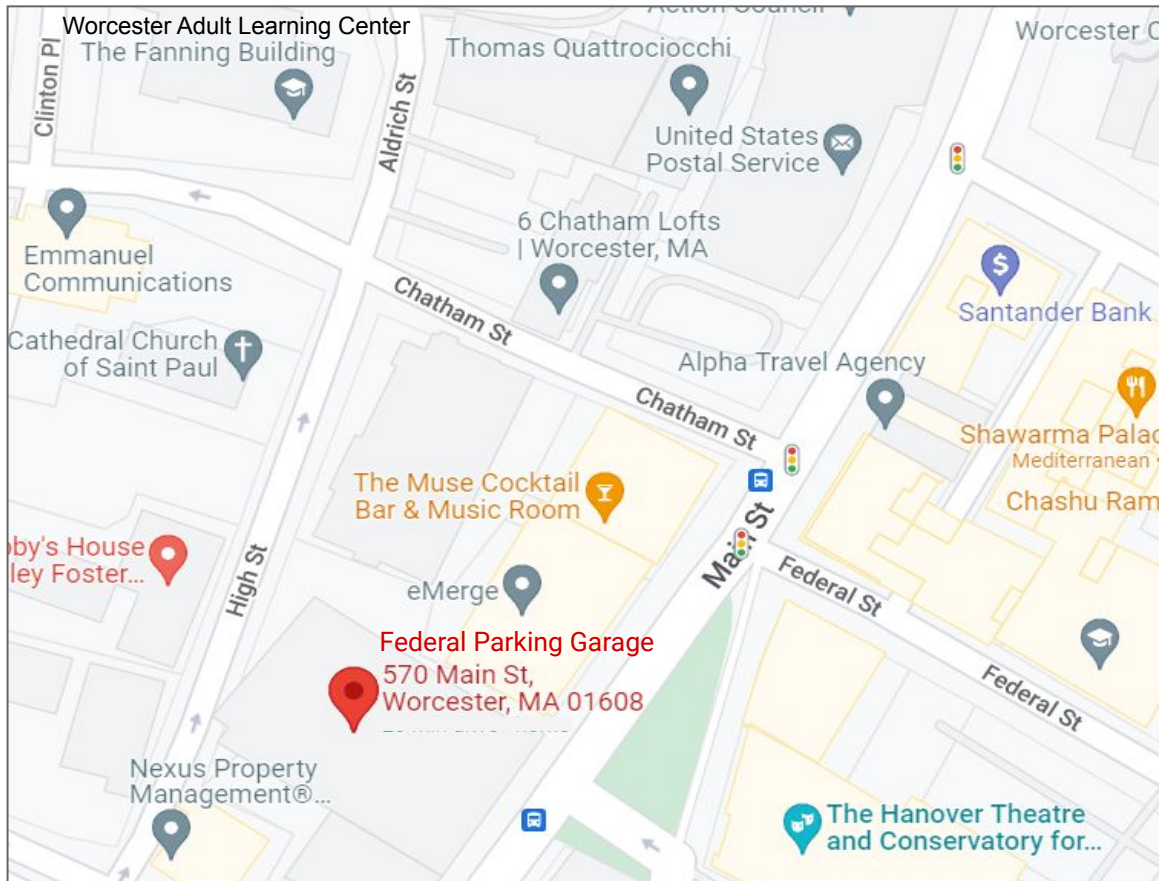

Students can park for free at the Federal Parking Garage, 570 Main Street, Worcester, MA.


The garage front entrance is on Main Street.

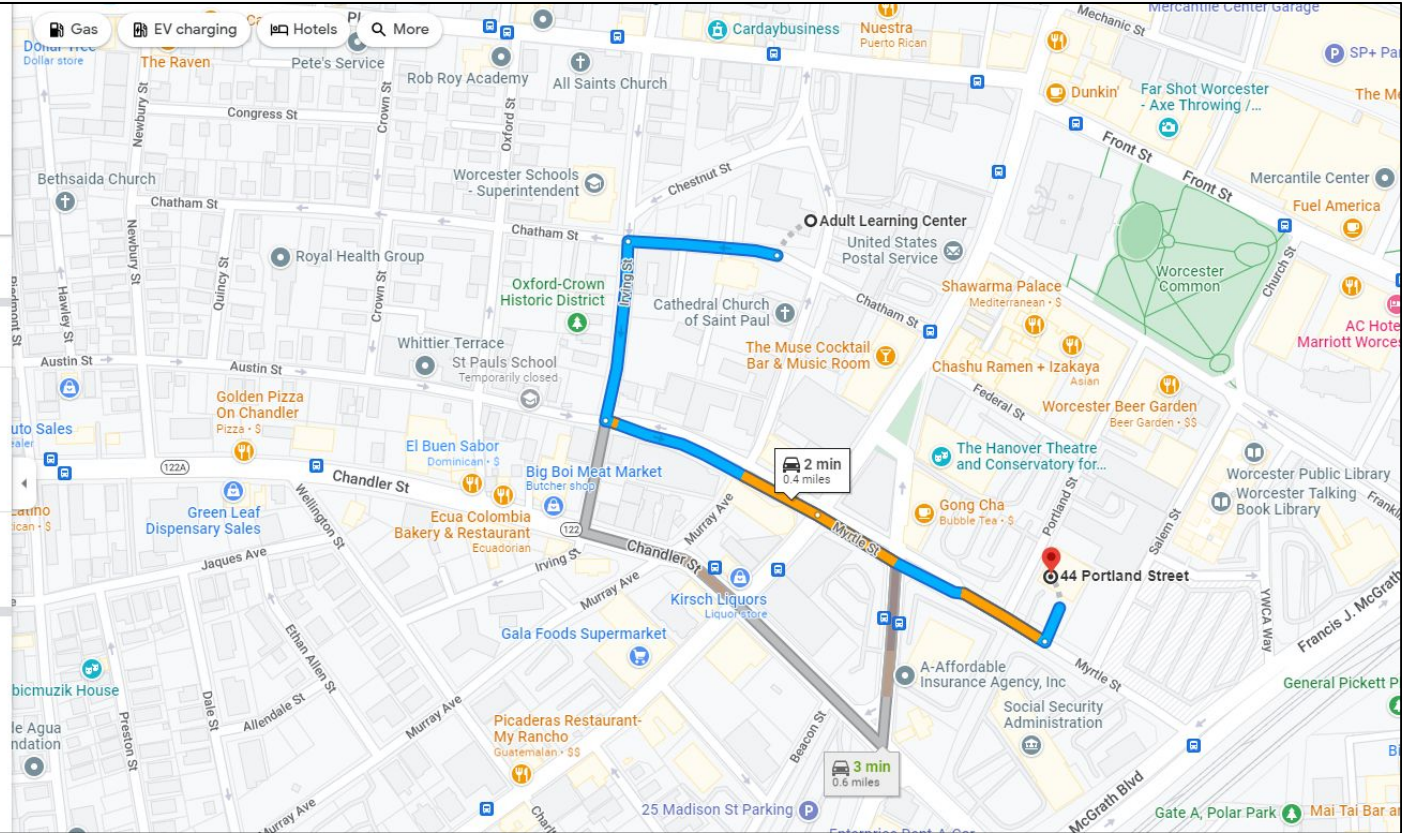

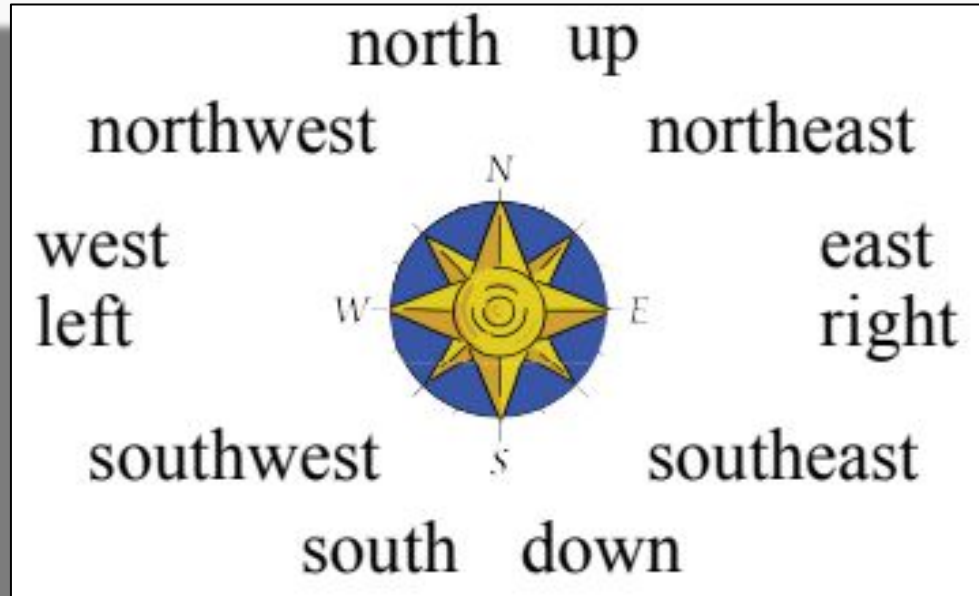

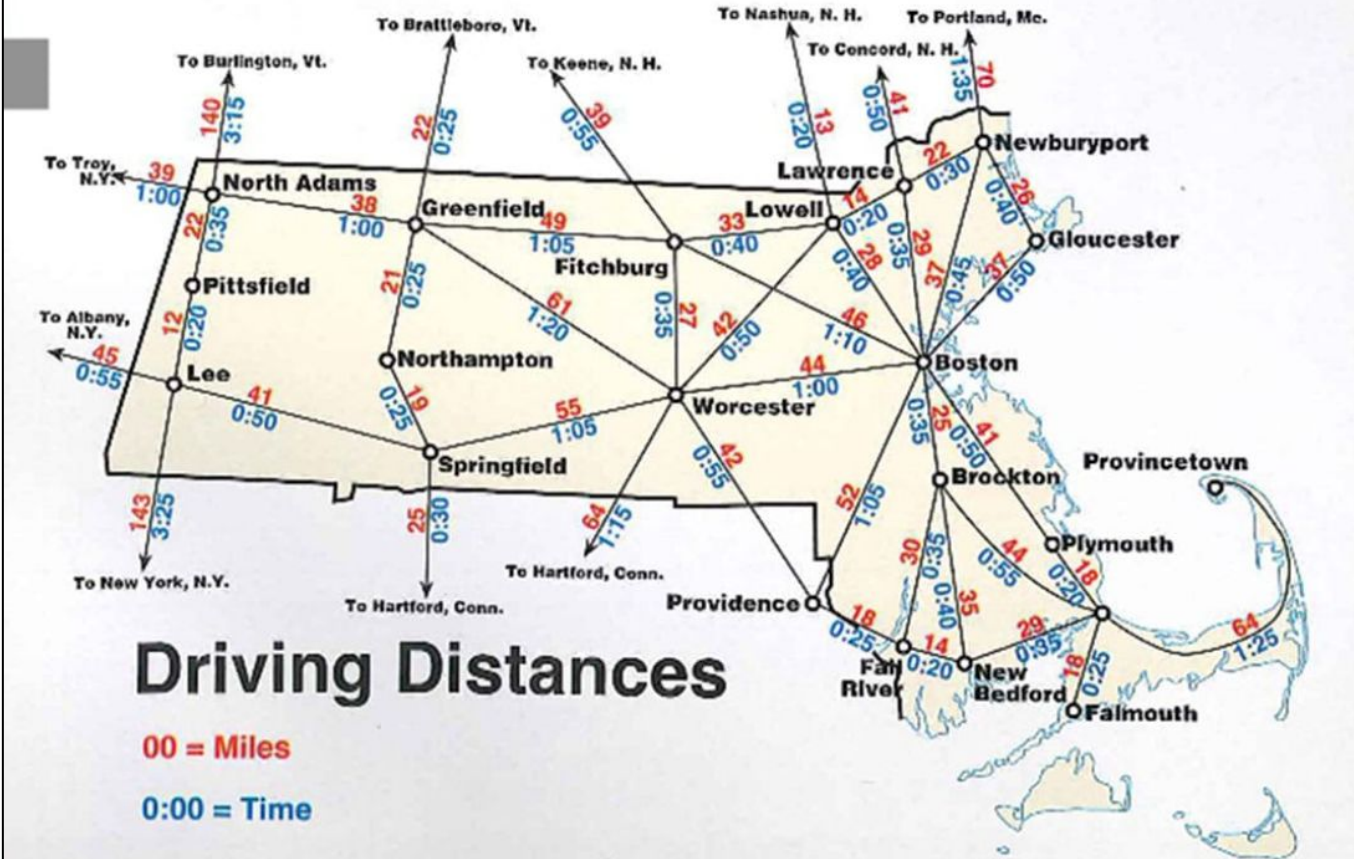
